2017: HISTORY IN THE MAKING

In 2017, Lutheran Social Services of the National Capital Area celebrated 100 years of Serving Boldly through a region-wide Day of Prayer, volunteer service days, and congregational discussions about future needs. Together, we recognized LSS/NCA's important role in engaging our community over the last century.

LSS/NCA was instrumental in welcoming displaced persons fleeing violence and persecution. They came seeking safety, a place where they could imagine a future filled with hope. In 2017, we resettled nearly 1,600 refugees in Maryland and Virginia, more individuals than the agency has resettled in any other year.

In addition, we continued to embrace vulnerable youth through our Children's Services program. We found loving homes for 75 D.C. foster children and 31 unaccompanied refugee minors escaping violence and desperation. Youth Haven camps added additional retreat weekends and family programming to strengthen open communication and encourage wellness despite the challenges of HIV/AIDS.

As we worked with local and government partners to embrace hundreds of refugee families and dozens of children, we broadened community awareness and empowered community members with town hall meetings and advocacy tools. Thank you for standing with us in our mission to offer hope and rebuild lives.


