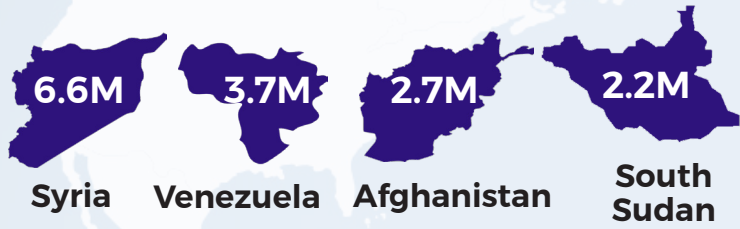

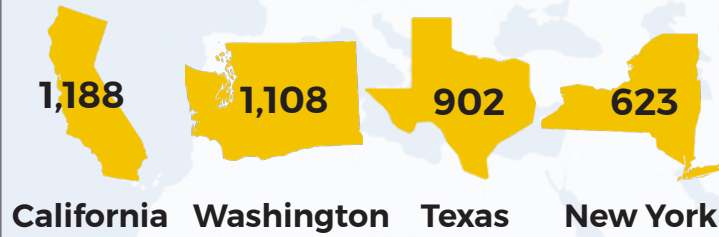
REFUGEE RESETTLEMENT

KNOW THE FACTS

58% of the world's refugees come from four countries



32% of refugees resettled in the U.S. in FY20 were hosted in four states



MIGRANT: a person who moves from one place to another, especially in order to find work or better living conditions.

REFUGEE: Someone who has been forced to flee his or her country because of persecution, war or violence. A refugee has a well-founded fear of persecution due to race, religion, nationality, political opinion or membership in a particular social group.

ASYLEE: a person who meets the definition of refugee and is already present in the United States or is seeking admission at a port of entry.

SIV: a special immigrant visa (SIV) is issued to Afghans & Iraqis who worked as translators or interpreters, or who were employed by, or on behalf of, the U.S. government and whose lives were threatened due to their work supporting the U.S. mission.

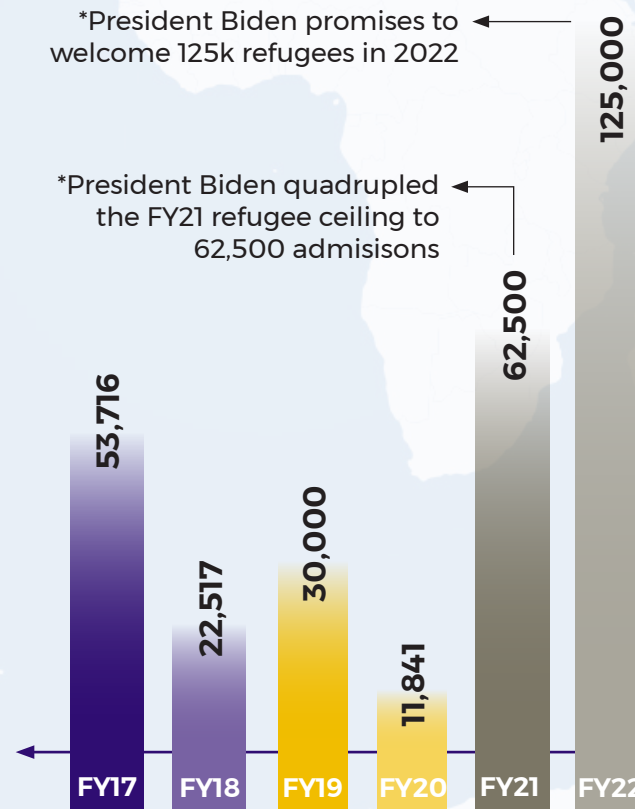

U.S. REFUGEE ADMISSIONS

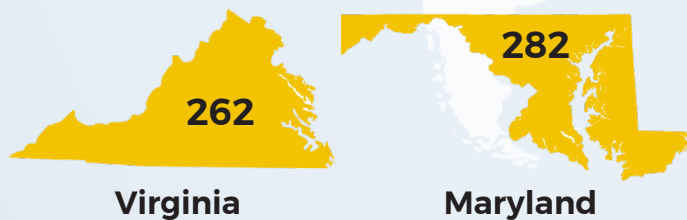
*President Biden promises to welcome 125k refugees in 2022
